Sarah owns her own cleaning business, but since the pandemic disrupted all our lives in 2020, she says she lost two-thirds of her clients. She took a second job to bridge the gap, but the extra income doesn't quite stretch far enough.

Now, it can be a challenge to afford daily expenses like food. With two kids at home, Sarah feels the pinch of high living costs, especially when it comes to groceries.

She began attending the Washington County Mobile Pantry after calling the Brazos Valley Food Bank and asking about local resources.

Now, Sarah visits the Mobile Pantry with her sister, Katina, who also picks up food for her family.

"You're always short on something," Katina says. "And that's where [the Mobile Pantry] comes into play," Sarah adds.
